

## How to provide feedback on the draft K–10 Australian Curriculum?

### What can you comment on?

The draft K–10 Australian Curriculum for English, mathematics, science and history will be available for consultation from March to May 2010.

Comment can be made on the following elements of the curriculum:

- Content descriptions which specify what is to be taught to students at each year level from Kindergarten (the year prior to Year 1) to Year 10.
- Achievement standards which describe the quality of learning (the depth of understanding, extent of knowledge and sophistication of skill) expected of students at each year level.
- Content elaborations which are examples that illustrate each content description.
- Annotated work samples that illustrate the achievement standard at each year level (a more complete set will become available over time).

### In what ways can you provide feedback?

The easiest way to provide feedback is by visiting the consultation website. By registering on this website you can read, review, download or print any, or all, of the draft K–10 Australian Curriculum.

As you view the curriculum on the website, you can provide feedback by using rating scales and/or writing comments with the click of a feedback button.

The website is also the place where individuals and groups can complete an online feedback survey.

Teachers in many schools will also be examining the curriculum materials in detail and providing feedback on the appropriateness and usefulness of the online curriculum. This practical application will provide very useful feedback to help review and improve the draft curriculum.
