The Recognition Committee considers that the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework allows for comparable educational outcomes for students by the end of Year 6 in relation to the Australian Curriculum: Humanities and Social Sciences, noting the following differences.

Achievement standards

Aspects of the Achievement Standard for Year 2 not demonstrated until the end of Class 3/Year 3 are:

- describe how people in different places are connected to each other and identify factors that influence these connections.
- locate information from observations and from sources provided
- compare objects from the past and present and interpret information and data to identify a point of view and draw simple conclusions
- sort and record data in tables, plans and on labelled maps

The Achievement Standards for Year 2 and Year 6 include a "range of texts" and a "range of communication forms". The Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework precludes the use of information communication technologies (digital forms and sources) until Year 8 to demonstrate these aspects of this learning area.

Recommendation

Noting that different approaches to learning are involved, the Recognition Committee considers that the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework allows for comparable educational outcomes for students by the end of Class 6/Year 6 in relation to the Australian Curriculum: Humanities and Social Sciences.

At the earlier comparison point of Year 2, the sequencing of some content and achievement varies between the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework and the Australian Curriculum: Humanities and Social Sciences. At the comparison point of Year 6 the achievement is comparable. If students transition to another school prior to the completion of Class 6/Year 6 there may be differences in their learning.









Civics and Citizenship

The Recognition Committee considers that the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework in Years 9 and 10 allows for comparable educational outcomes for students by the end of Year 10 in relation to the Australian Curriculum: Civics and Citizenship in Years 7 and 8.

Achievement standards

Aspects of the Achievement Standard for Year 8 not fully demonstrated until the end of Year 10 are:

- explain how laws are made
- analyse issues about national identity and the factors that contribute to people's sense of belonging
- develop a range of questions to investigate Australia's political and legal systems
- critically analyse information gathered from different sources for relevance
- explain different points of view on civics and citizenship issues
- when planning for action, take into account multiple perspectives, use democratic processes, and develop solutions to an issue
- develop and present reasoned arguments on civics and citizenship issues using appropriate texts, subject-specific language and concepts

Recommendation

Noting that different approaches to learning are involved, the Recognition Committee considers that the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework allows for comparable educational outcomes for students by the end of Year 10 in relation to the Australian Curriculum: Civics and Citizenship for Year 7 and Year 8.

At the Year 8 comparison point the sequencing of some content and achievement varies between the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework and the Australian Curriculum: Civics and Citizenship. If students transition to another school prior to the completion of Year 10 there may be differences in their learning.

The Recognition Committee considers that the Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework allows for comparable educational outcomes for students by the end of Class 2/Year 2 in relation to the Australian Curriculum: English, noting the following differences.

Achievement standards

Aspects of the Achievement Standard for Year 2 not fully demonstrated until the end of Class 3 are:







- read texts that contain varied sentence structures, some unfamiliar vocabulary, a significant number of high-frequency sight words and images that provide extra information
- monitor meaning and self-correct using knowledge of phonics, syntax, punctuation, semantics and context.
- · identify literal and implied meaning, main ideas and supporting detail
- explain their preferences for aspects of texts using other texts as comparisons
- create texts, drawing on their own experiences, their imagination and information they have learnt

Recommendation

Noting that different approaches to learning are involved, the Recognition Committee considers that the *Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework* allows for **comparable educational outcomes for students by the end of Class2/Year 2** in relation to the *Australian Curriculum: English*.

At the Year 2 comparison point, the sequencing of some content and achievement varies between the *Australian Steiner Curriculum Framework* and the *Australian Curriculum: English*. If students transition to another school prior to completing Class3/Year 3 there may be differences in their learning.
