Professor John O'Toole is the Foundation Chair of Arts Education at the University of Melbourne (and also Australia's first professor or chair of Arts Education). He was formerly Professor of Drama Education and Applied Theatre at Griffith University. He spent twelve years teaching in secondary schools, becoming a Senior Teacher and Head of Curriculum, and also worked in theatre-in-education and community theatre companies as writer, education officer and director. For over thirty years he has been teaching and researching in Colleges of Advanced Education and Universities, and has taught and demonstrated arts pedagogy and curriculum at all levels from pre-school to adult, and on all continents.

He has been intimately involved with the development of drama and arts education in Australia, being a founder member of the drama teachers' associations of Queensland (QADIE, now Drama Queensland), nationally (NADIE, now Drama Australia) and internationally (IDEA). He co-wrote the first syllabus for Senior Drama in Queensland (1991), and established the first Drama and Dance teacher education courses in Queensland (Brisbane CAE1980-1986). At Griffith Professor O'Toole established the B.Ed in Drama and the BA in Applied Theatre). He has many international connections, and in 1995 was Co-Convenor of the 2nd IDEA World Congress in Brisbane and from 1995-2004 was IDEA Director of Publications. More broadly across the Arts, he was the National Coordinator of the Mayer Key Competencies Arts Education Project (1996), co-wrote the Advocacy Paper for the National Affiliation of Arts Educators (1996), and in 2005 and 2006 he was appointed by MCEETYA as the Australian representative of Arts Education at the UNESCO Conferences on Arts Education in Korea and Lisbon (the first UNESCO World Conference).

Professor O'Toole is a prolific writer and co-writer of both textbooks and scholarly publications, with standard text-books like *Dramawise* (1987, with Brad Haseman) and *Pretending to Learn*

(2004 with Julie Dunn) translated into Chinese, Danish and Italian, and most recently *Education in the Arts* (2008, with Chris Sinclair & Neryl Jeanneret). Standard scholarly texts include the first book on *Theatre in Education* (1977), *The Process of Drama (1992), Cooling Conflict -* on using drama and peer teaching to empower students to manage bullying and conflict in schools (2004 with Bruce Burton) - and just published, *Drama and Curriculum* (with Madonna Stinson). In 2001 he was awarded the American Alliance for Theatre and Education Award for Lifetime Achievement.
